**HERITAGE PARK INVASIVE SPECIES INVENTORY
TUESDAY, JULY 24, 2018 6PM – 8PM**

Learn how to identify and report invasive species at Heritage Township Park this summer.

Join the Mid-Michigan Cooperative Invasive Species Management Area (CISMA) and Watertown Township staff for an invasive species survey of Heritage Township Park on Tuesday, July 24th from 6:00-8:00 pm. YOU can help the efforts of the Mid-Michigan CISMA by reporting invasive species in your area.

Mid-Michigan CISMA staff will provide a brief training on what is an invasive species and identification of CISMA priority species, including black swallow-wort, Japanese knotweed, and invasive Phragmites, as well as how to report them using the Midwest Invasive Species Information Network (MISIN) app. After training, we will survey the park and report what we find. If you would like to learn to use the MISIN app, please register for a free account at www.misin.msu.edu and download the app prior to the survey date.
